It was as though you were praying over us and the situation right there in the room. Your love and support was felt as the presence of God filled the room with His peace.

As many of you know, my father came through surgery like a champ and he is on the road to recovery. I know this road is long, but I know you will continue to lift him up to our Father to protect him and heal him over time. There were many people from our church who were also praying, but I wanted to specifically thank you, my fellow Master'Singers, for interceding for my father and for responding to our need and loving us as the church. I have said this before, and I'll say it again: there is just something special about Master'Singers. Let us continue to serve together as we are called to be God's people.

Our whole church is excited to host the group and are beginning to spread the word to our community and places of business.

When you arrive at East Side, we ask that everyone park in the north


parking lot across E Poplar St. from our building (at the corner of N 6th Ave). We will have parking greeters available as you arrive to guide you to the right area. When walking back across the street to our building, you will walk to the right of our gym (jutting out toward E Poplar St.) and enter at our main gym entrance. You are welcome to drop off those with physical issues by this door before parking.

If you came to the Williams Baptist Concert last year, we are only 30 minutes east coming down Hwy 412. Those coming from directly south or near the Memphis area will probably end up coming into Paragould on Hwy 49 from Jonesboro. These are the 2 main roads into Paragould and they intersect by the McDonalds, Walgreens, and CVS. From this intersection you continue east on Hwy 412, go over the train overpass, and turn on either 5th or 6th Ave and continue 4 blocks to our campus. Our address is 529 E Court St. The north parking area is directly behind our building.

There are many places to eat in Paragould. Some of the closest in proximity to our church are Skinny J's and Hyde Park Café, right in the heart of downtown Paragould. If you are coming in Hwy 412 from Walnut Ridge you will pass many places along your path: Larry's Pizza (buffet), Ikura (Japanese & sushi), Zaxby's, Chili's, Fazzoli's, as well as a variety of Mexican restaurants and fast food choices. If you are needing a place to stay for the night, there is a Holiday Inn Express and Hampton Inn both near each other on Hwy 49S.

We are looking forward to a wonderful time of fellowship and worship with those coming our way for the split concert. See you on Thursday, March 28th!

Our church is located at 1400 Grand Ave., Fort Smith, AR 72901.

- If you are coming in from the South, the best way into Fort Smith is on US-71N which will take you all the way into downtown where the church is located.
- If you are coming from the East, the best way into Fort Smith is to take I-40 W to I-540 S and then take the Grand Ave. Exit (#6) which will take you directly to the church.
- If you are coming from the North, the best way into Fort Smith is to take I-49 S to I-40 W to I-540 S and take the Grand Ave. Exit (#6) which will take you directly to the church.


There are a number of great places to eat downtown; Neumeier's Rib Room, La Huerta, Bricktown, Rolando's, or Gus's. A couple other great local places that are close by are George's (burgers and sandwiches) on Grand Ave. or Burrito Bowl (local version of Chipotle) on Rogers Ave. There are many other restaurants like Chill's, Friday's, Texas Roadhouse, Logan's Roadhouse, Red Lobster, Olive Garden, and Outback, as well as many fast food places in town.

If you decide to stay the night in Fort Smith, the DoubleTree and the Marriott are very close to the church and are within walking distance to all the downtown restaurants. There is a Hampton Inn right off of I-540 and there is also a brand new Fairfield Inn and Suites on Phoenix Ave.

I know it's a sacrifice to drive across the state to be with us, but we greatly appreciate your willingness to come. I am praying that God will bless our evening together and that He would glorify Himself through us.
