A "Sacrifice" of Praise?

"Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of the lips that acknowledge his name." (Romans 8:15)

We bring the sacrifice of praise
Into the house of the Lord.
And we offer up to You
The sacrifices of thanksgiving;
And we offer up to You
The sacrifices of joy.

Is confession good for the soul... really? OK, then – here's goes.

I never liked this song.

There – I said it. Maybe it's because it just didn't do anything for me musically. But my gut hunch is that it just felt too "surfacey" for me. And I'll admit that was largely my problem, not the song's.

Maybe it's the juxtaposition of "sacrifice" and "praise." One is all about cost and the other can often be offered easily at no expense to ourselves. We can readily give praise when God's blessings come. We can praise an employee for a job well done or our dog for fetching the ball. Praise isn't always a sacrifice.

So then, what are we to do with King David's protesting in 2 Samuel 24:24? When a devoted subject offered to cover the cost of David's sacrifice, he replied, "I will not sacrifice to the LORD my God burnt offerings that cost me nothing."

Maybe the key is in the qualifying adverb in the Romans passage. If we are to "continually" offer up praise, then that will cost us, indeed. Sometimes, it may cost us dearly – for praise (or, as the song says, thanksgiving and joy) in the middle of all circumstances, may come at a high price.

Let's be honest. As worship leaders, it is literally our "job" to continually offer a sacrifice of praise. But it is required as believers, as well. The context of the Romans passage is the old system of sacrifice and Jesus' ultimate sacrifice of his life and blood. It's not about happy worship choruses. It concludes with "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God."

"Do good and share what [we] have." Isn't that the blessing of being one of the Master'Singers? As we begin a new season of serving together, there may be sacrifice – but "such sacrifices are pleasing to God."


