Filled with the Spirit

One of Paul's most fascinating teachings has to be in Ephesians 5:18. After all of the preceding cautions on the various things we are to "put off" (lying, anger, vulgar talk, bitterness, rage, fighting, slander, sexual immorality, greed, and obscenity), we come to "Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit."

That's it? That's how to live victoriously" Just don't get drunk?

No - this is far, far more than an admonition against intoxication. Don't miss what Paul is saying here. He is actually making a comparison - drawing a parallel. Paul is saying, "Don't get drunk on THIS - get drunk on THAT." "Don't be under the control of alcohol - be under the control of the Spirit."

Let's take a step back and ask ourselves, "How do you get drunk.. on anything?" Very simply, you consume it - a lot of it. So, how can you drink the Spirit? Paul said, "Those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit" (Romans 8:5). So, drinking the Spirit means setting our minds on the things of the Spirit. And setting our minds on the things of the Spirit means being incredibly focused on God's written Word to us - and His inner voice that communicates with us in prayer. If we do this long enough, we will get "drunk" with the Spirit. In fact, we will get addicted to the Spirit. Instead of chemical dependency we will develop a wonderful Spirit-dependency.

Then comes the verse of validation we worship leaders love most. What does that LOOK like? What is the first evidence of being influenced by/ drunk on/ under the influence of the Spirit that Paul mentions?

"... speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord." (Eph 5:19)

How about that? A spirit-filled Christian is a singing Christian. And THAT kind of Jesus-follower is joyful, thankful, and submissive. (vss 20-21) Note, however - we are not joyful BECAUSE we sing. Too many musicians get that backwards. Then, when the thrill of the music isn't there, so goes the joy. No - the music can never be the source. I don't sing to make me happy.

"I sing because I'm happy. I sing because I'm free."
