It's been a by-line in marketing for everything from Porsches to pharmaceuticals. While its literal truth in those arenas might

be subject to question, the overall sentiment is spot on. "If there is a REAL thing and a SIMILAR thing, would the REAL thing not always be the better choice?"

2 Peter 1:12-21 is an interesting passage that begins with Peter basically explaining why he repeats himself. "I will always remind you of these things..." He knows he will be dying soon and, even facing death, he states, "And I will make every effort to see that after my departure you will always be able to remember these things." Then he concludes with this amazing statement. "Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation of things. For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." (2 Peter 1:20-21)

Accept no substitute.

This is why I will forever beat the drum of the importance of diving deeply into God's Word daily. Read anything else you like for added understanding. Listen to whatever compliments biblical teaching. But the peril in missing out on the Word itself is two-fold. On one hand, it's a bit like jumping into the medical field in some such area as heart transplants or retinal repair without having actually initially completed medical school. It's well and good to be intelligent and well-intentioned, but the foundational knowledge required is simply absent. Or maybe it's rather like studying one dead thing after another when, all the while, there is a live subject to be researched that can yield far more data and understanding in one sitting than all of the others in a lifetime.

"For the word of God is alive and active." (Hebrews 4:12)

When Lee was little, we had the opportunity to tour the FBI headquarters in Washington DC. In addition to the visceral fun of shooting various automatic weapons in their firing range (Lee shooting an old-school Tommy gun), we also saw an amazing collection of counterfeit money collected over the years in various arrests. Some were laughable but some were so astonishingly good that you simply couldn't figure out how the counterfeit could be distinguished from the original, when placed side by side. The well-worn, familiar wisdom that would have seemed cliché any other day actually had a real-life application as it related to paper money - and as it relates to inspiration from God. "Study the original." Know it intimately and you will recognize anything lesser.


