

The name of our group is one of the most important, although misleading at times, identifiers of who we are as a group and why we do what we do. Without the explanation of the apostrophe and shared letter, people hear that we are "master singers". Which can communicate the exact opposite of our identity. "Master Singers" are eager to show of who they are and what they can do. We, of course as the Master'Singers, are looking to show off our Master and what He can do.

Mark 10 tells the story of James and John looking for that glory. They were outright asking Jesus to sit at His right and left hand in glory. Jesus then teaches them that to receive "glory" one must first become a servant. He says in vs. 45, "For even the Son of man came not to be served, but to serve." The gospel of Mark then pairs this story in verses 35-45, with the story of blind Bartimaeus in verses 46-52. Notice the difference in how James/John and Bartimaeus petition Jesus. Jame/John seeking glory and Bartimaeus crying, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!". Author Scotty Ward Smith writes, "James and John were physically seeing were spiritually blind—as revealed by their quest for greatness. Bartimaeus was physically blind, but spiritually seeing—as revealed by his cry for mercy."

May we approach this concert with a sense of humility and servanthood, like Bartimaeus, rather than the self-seeking desires of James and John. Smith further writes, "Glory isn't gained through ruling but through serving—by taking the lowest place, not the highest." We are our Master's singers. May we use the opportunities this concert season will give us to disappear in the shadow of our Master!

### MINISTRY DAY: DERMOTT UNIT


Information from Bob Fielding regarding details for our ministry day at the Dermott Unit.

## **NEWS YOU NEED TO KNOW...**



## Welcome to Planning Center Online



We are so excited to introduce Planning Center Online (PCO) to you this year. We will utilize PCO for all of our concert scheduling and registrations as well as storing and sharing all our music charts and recordings for the year. PCO is an incredibly powerful tool that will enable us to share information more readily.

### **Registering for Concerts of Worship and other Events**

For each event, everyone will receive a scheduling request via email. At the bottom of that email are two links, one to "Accept" and one to "Decline" the request from PCO. If you plan on attending the concert/event, please accept the request, and if you cannot attend, please decline the request. When you "Accept," you are counted for two very important reasons: the Meal before the concert and to let us know how many are coming in each section and the orchestra. By doing so, the host church can best prepare for our arrival. The deadline for being included in the meal count is by NOON on the Monday BEFORE the event. Please help us help our hosts by replying promptly.

Scheduling emails are sent out from PCO two weeks prior to the concert. If you are NOT receiving these email requests, please do the following: 1) check your junk/spam folder as these emails may end up there, 2) log in to PCO and ensure that you are checking the right email account, 3) if neither of the two previous options help, contact Lamona Gunter at the ABSC for assistance. <a href="mailto:lgunter@absc.org">lgunter@absc.org</a>

#### **Acquiring Music Files**

Music charts and recordings will no longer be available on the Master'Singers website. All of these tasks will now be included in your PCO account. To view the files, you must go to the "SERVICE" (concert) in which you are scheduled to sing/play.

Once you accept your invitation, if you are viewing the service on your computer (not your smart phone or tablet), select the service in the "PLANS" tab at the top. On the right hand side of each song in the order of service, select the gray box with the number in it to access each song's files.

#### **Music Stand App**

If you have a tablet you can use PCO's Music stand App. It is available for free in the App Stores for free for both Apple and Android devices. To access the music for each concert/service, simply log in to Music Stand with your PCO credentials (see below). You can then navigate to the particular Service (concert) and your music will be in order and ready for you to view. This works with both singers and instrumentalists.

#### **Forgot Your Login?**

If you have forgotten your PCO login, simply click the "Need a password?" link on the PCO login page. Enter the email address that you use to log in, and PCO will send you a password reset email.

#### **Updating Your Information**

Be sure to take some time to update your contact information in PCO so that our database is correct.

- 1. Log in to PCO and click your name in the upper right portion of the screen and select "Profile"
- 2. Once you are in the profile section, click "Edit" next to your name and enter any updated info.
- 3. Click "Save"
- 4. If you do not have a profile picture, click on the silhouette next to your name and upload one.
