It is sometimes difficult to encourage enthusiasm in our choirs and worship teams as we prepare them to lead our congregations in worship. There are days when we just don't feel very enthusiastic. We can often become so focused on the correct pitch, vowel production, or rhythm that we find ourselves not very excited about what we are doing. In those moments we need to take a step back and consider not the "what" we are doing but be reminded of the "why" we are doing it.

I was recently reminded of a phrase John Bolin, worship pastor and writer/arranger with Semsen Music, used at a recent worship leader's luncheon as he addressed this very topic. He discussed the balance needed between precision and passion. He stated that as musicians, we can become so consumed with musical precision that we lose our worshipful passion. There needs to be a healthy balance between the two so that neither suffers. We want the passion of the "why" to be evident through the precision of the "what."

In Luke 7:36-50, Luke writes of a beautiful picture of worship as a woman enters a dinner banquet and washes Jesus' feet with her tears and wipes them with her hair. She then anoints Jesus' feet with ointment. The woman was driven by passion in response to Jesus' presence. The pharisee however, was driven by the precision of the law and his duties as a religious leader. He welcomed Jesus into his home out of duty, not passion. He gave Jesus no greeting. He did not offer to wash Jesus' feet and he offered Jesus no oil as an ointment. His response to Jesus' presence was precise, but with no passion.

As worship leaders, let's once again be reminded of why we sing and let that why fuel our passion. We sing because the love of Jesus has penetrated our hearts and has given us life in Him. We gather as Master'Singers to fellowship with one another in rehearsal as we offer our hearts to God with passion and precision. When our enthusiasm wanes, let us remind one another of the grace that reconciled us to God and let our worship and our worship leading be in response to this glorious truth.

If your voice becomes too noticeable, rest assured that you are but a beginner in your

art."

May this challenge us in our leadership during our remaining concerts of worship. As Spurgeon said, "May we...think very much of God, much of the singing, and... little of (ourselves)."



NEWS YOU NEED TO KNOW... Welcome to Planning Center Online

We are so excited to introduce Planning Center Online (PCO) to you this year. We will utilize PCO for all of our concert scheduling and registrations as well as storing and sharing all our music charts and recordings for the year. PCO is an incredibly powerful tool that will enable us to share information more readily.

Registering for Concerts of Worship and other Events

For each event, everyone will receive a scheduling request via email. At the bottom of that email are two links, one to "Accept" and one to "Decline" the request from PCO. If you plan on attending the concert/event, please accept the request, and if you cannot attend, please decline the request. When you "Accept," you are counted for two very important reasons: the Meal before the concert and to let us know how many are coming in each section and the orchestra. By doing so, the host church can best prepare for our arrival. The deadline for being included in the meal count is by NOON on the Monday BEFORE the event. Please help us help our hosts by replying promptly.

Scheduling emails are sent out from PCO two weeks prior to the concert. If you are NOT receiving these email requests, please do the following: 1) check your junk/spam folder as these emails may end up there, 2) log in to PCO and ensure that you are checking the right email account, 3) if neither of the two previous options help, contact Lamona Gunter at the ABSC for assistance. <u>lgunter@absc.org</u>

Acquiring Music Files

Music charts and recordings will no longer be available on the Master'Singers website. All of these tasks will now be included in your PCO account. To view the files, you must go to the "SERVICE" (concert) in which you are scheduled to sing/play.

Once you accept your invitation, if you are viewing the service on your computer (not your smart phone or tablet), select the service in the "PLANS" tab at the top. On the right hand side of each song in the order of service, select the gray box with the number in it to access each song's files.

Music Stand App

If you have a tablet you can use PCO's Music stand App. It is available for free in the App Stores for free for both Apple and Android devices. To access the music for each concert/service, simply log in to Music Stand with your PCO credentials (see below). You can then navigate to the particular Service (concert) and your music will be in order and ready for you to view. This works with both singers and instrumentalists.

Forgot Your Login?

If you have forgotten your PCO login, simply click the "Need a password?" link on the PCO login page. Enter the email address that you use to log in, and PCO will send you a password reset email.

Updating Your Information

Be sure to take some time to update your contact information in PCO so that our database is correct.

- 1. Log in to PCO and click your name in the upper right portion of the screen and select "Profile"
- 2. Once you are in the profile section, click "Edit" next to your name and enter any updated info.
- 3. Click "Save"
- 4. If you do not have a profile picture, click on the silhouette next to your name and upload one.
