It is time for us to divide and conquer! Usually, when we discuss

However, by dividing into two ministry teams, we will have the opportunity to double our efforts and lead in settings which might not be possible any other way. Join me in prayer as we look ahead to what the Lord is going to do at each location.

Colossians 3:15 and 16 says, "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which you were called in one body, and be thankful. Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God." This has been my life verse since God called me to ministry, but He is continually teaching me new things as I study this passage. Below are a couple of thoughts from the passage as we prepare to lead once again:

"Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts..." We are told to "allow" (let) the peace of Christ rule. Fear and anxiety do not come from our Lord. He wants us to experience His peace, and for us to allow His peace to rule our hearts. We are to serve together as "one body." A body serves best when all the members of that body function as they are supposed to function, and in unity with one another.

We are to "Let the word of Christ dwell" within us. His Word and the principles of His Word are to take up residence (dwell) in us to the point that everything we do or say is controlled by His indwelling Word. Then, from that Word we find wisdom, useful for "teaching and admonishing one another." We teach, admonish, and encourage one another with the words of Christ, not our best advice or opinions. And then...we have the opportunity to use the powerful medium of music, "Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs" to complete the task.

What a beautiful outline of power, service and leadership, and what a powerful medium we have been given. I am praying each of us will come ready musically to offer the Lord our very best as we handle and proclaim the Gospel on March 14th. But I am also praying, and even more so, that the Spirit of God will grant us the peace of God to rule our hearts, and that the Word of Christ would dwell within us, empowering the message we sing. Join me as we pray, practice, and prepare to lead at both locations. May the Lord use us as powerful instruments for His glory.

We are so excited to have you at Greenwood First Baptist! Our church has never had the privilege of hosting the Master'Singers, so this is an exciting event for us. Greenwood is just South of Fort Smith and is a town known for its schools and its family-friendly environment. People have even referred to it as a modern-day "Mayberry." I know that this is a long drive and out of the way for many of you, but your sacrifice to be here will be a blessing to our

church and our community.

Our church is located at 19 N. Adair St. with a campus that is spread out with several different buildings. Our worship center will be our main hub when you all are here. Some of you can park in our "Cross Parking" located right off Hwy 10, which runs through the middle of town, or you can turn into the church campus on Adair St., where you will find several areas to park. Check-in will be inside the foyer of the Worship Center.

If you arrive early for lunch, there are a few different places to eat in Greenwood. There are some fast-food places (McDonald's, Taco Bell, Geno's Pizza, Sonic, etc.) and a few dine-in restaurants. The Dari is a local favorite, and some of the best BBQ around is at Reid's Hometown Barbecue, about 30 minutes East of Greenwood in Booneville, AR.

If you plan to stay overnight, there are a few Airbnb options in Greenwood, but the best option for a hotel is to stay in Fort Smith, where there are several different places to choose from.

Sadly, there aren't many great places to eat in Hamburg, but there will be a few food trucks set up on the town square as well as a few lunch spots (Fiesta Linda and Boujee Boards & More). However for those coming from central Arkansas, there are spots to eat in Monticello (about 30 minutes away) so you may want to grab food there before coming into town.

Overnight stays would be best spent at the Tru by Hilton in Crossett (20 minutes from Hamburg) or at one of the hotels in Monticello (Hampton Inn, Holiday Inn Express, Quality Inn & Suites, Comfort Inn & Suites, etc.)

NEWS YOU NEED TO KNOW... Welcome to Planning Center Online

We are so excited to introduce Planning Center Online (PCO) to you this year. We will utilize PCO for all of our concert scheduling and registrations as well as storing and sharing all our music charts and recordings for the year. PCO is an incredibly powerful tool that will enable us to share information more readily.

Registering for Concerts of Worship and other Events

For each event, everyone will receive a scheduling request via email. At the bottom of that email are two links, one to "Accept" and one to "Decline" the request from PCO. If you plan on attending the concert/event, please accept the request, and if you cannot attend, please decline the request. When you "Accept," you are counted for two very important reasons: the Meal before the concert and to let us know how many are coming in each section and the orchestra. By doing so, the host church can best prepare for our arrival. The deadline for being included in the meal count is by NOON on the Monday BEFORE the event. Please help us help our hosts by replying promptly.

Scheduling emails are sent out from PCO two weeks prior to the concert. If you are NOT receiving these email requests, please do the following: 1) check your junk/spam folder as these emails may end up there, 2) log in to PCO and ensure that you are checking the right email account, 3) if neither of the two previous options help, contact Lamona Gunter at the ABSC for assistance. <u>lgunter@absc.org</u>

Acquiring Music Files

Music charts and recordings will no longer be available on the Master'Singers website. All of these tasks will now be included in your PCO account. To view the files, you must go to the "SERVICE" (concert) in which you are scheduled to sing/play.

Once you accept your invitation, if you are viewing the service on your computer (not your smart phone or tablet), select the service in the "PLANS" tab at the top. On the right hand side of each song in the order of service, select the gray box with the number in it to access each song's files.

Music Stand App

If you have a tablet you can use PCO's Music stand App. It is available for free in the App Stores for free for both Apple and Android devices. To access the music for each concert/service, simply log in to Music Stand with your PCO credentials (see below). You can then navigate to the particular Service (concert) and your music will be in order and ready for you to view. This works with both singers and instrumentalists.

Forgot Your Login?

If you have forgotten your PCO login, simply click the "Need a password?" link on the PCO login page. Enter the email address that you use to log in, and PCO will send you a password reset email.

Updating Your Information

Be sure to take some time to update your contact information in PCO so that our database is correct.

- 1. Log in to PCO and click your name in the upper right portion of the screen and select "Profile"
- 2. Once you are in the profile section, click "Edit" next to your name and enter any updated info.
- 3. Click "Save"
- 4. If you do not have a profile picture, click on the silhouette next to your name and upload one.
