

"Here I am Lord...Send Me" As worshipers and worship leaders we often read and discuss Isaiah 6 and John 4. Those are two of my favorite "worship" texts. Isaiah saw the Lord on




His throne, high and lifted up. The description of the throne room moved him through a wonderful model of personal and corporate worship. The discussion Jesus had with the woman at the well describes for us the definition of biblical worship and how it is rooted in spirit and in truth. But we often miss the response of biblical worship. The revelation of Jesus always prompts a response.

In Isaiah, the prophet's final response to the throne room vision was, "Here I am Lord...send me" (Isaiah 6:8). The discourse between Jesus and the woman ends with a response. The woman's response was not in words but in actions. "So the woman left her water jar and went away into town and said to the people, Come see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" (John 4:28-29).

True, biblical worship ends with a biblical response, and evidence of that response is a changed life. I do not believe that we can encounter Jesus in authentic, biblical worship and not be changed. Sometimes that change is from death to life through salvation. Sometimes that change is confession and repentance of sin and a renewed commitment to the call of Christ. Sometimes that response is an abandoned proclamation of the Gospel to a lost and dying world.

As the Master'Singers, it is our hope that true, biblical worship occurs each time we gather. We gather to celebrate and proclaim the Gospel. We gather to express our love for our Savior in song to one another. We gather to use our talents and the message of the Gospel to encourage the believer and engage the lost with hope. It is my prayer for the Spirit of God to use us as instruments for His Kingdom. But it is also my prayer that each of us are changed each time as well. It is my prayer that we leave proclaiming, "Come see this man..."

May the Lord bless our upcoming opportunities of ministry with His convicting power. May we be changed by His presence like the prophet Isaiah and the woman at the well. May our true, biblical response to each wonderful time of worship be, "Here I am Lord... send me!"

Psalm 24:1, "The earth and everything in it, the world and its inhabitants, belong to the Lord" - As I reflect on the powerfulness of this verse, I am reminded that the Lord is the creator of ALL things. Looking Ahead Jeremy Raines Men's Chorus President



It's hard to believe, but in less than two weeks we'll convene once again at Geyer Springs FBC on Oct. 22nd for the Annual Meeting. I'm really excited for the season and all of the great worship venues we have across the state. I must admit however, I find myself looking ahead to the end of May and our Costa Rica mission trip. Like some of you, this will be my first trip with Master'Singers, and it'll probably be one of the more "Hands On" experiences that I've had the opportunity to be a part of.

In preparation for this newsletter, I wanted to dive into the Word and see accounts of first time missionary experiences. I immediately came across Paul's first missionary journey in Acts 13-14. In his passion for sharing the story of Jesus, Paul traveled thousands of miles. Crossing land and sea and visiting countries such as Greece, Turkey, and Syria. Paul reflects on the journey in 2 Corinthians, noting the dangers he faced from travel, as well as opposition he faced from fellow Jews and Gentiles. It was rougher than anything we can imagine today.

However, we must focus on the miracles that took place.

- -In Cyprus, though he encountered evil forces, Paul was able to lead a prominent governor of the area to Christ.
- -In Asia Minor, Paul, facing opposition from his ministry team and the Jews, focused his ministry on the Gentiles and many people heard the gospel for the first time that day.
- -In Iconium Paul and Barnabas were able to reach both Jews and Gentiles like, and show that the gospel was meant for all people groups.

-In Lystra, Paul healed a lame man, faced violent opposition which left him badly injured, yet he recovered and by God's grace, was able to encourage new believers, appoint elders, and even build new churches.

On May 27th-June 2nd 2025, We will be presented with an opportunity to do the same thing in Costa Rica as Paul did so long ago. We may not face the same dangers, the same opposition, or even the same travel complications as Paul did, but we will have the same Gospel to share. Even in this day and age, there is still someone out there who has never heard the Gospel before. I want to encourage all my Master'Singer friends to join me in signing up to go to Costa Rica. As it says in Matthew 9. The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few.
